

A Message from the CCMS President

We have reached the end of another busy "season" in Collier County, and I hope you all have some downtime planned for this spring or summer to recoup from the demands we face with the influx of visitors, snowbirds, and patients during the winter months. A reminder that the CCMS Physician Wellness Program is available to members for

up to 6 confidential, complimentary sessions per year with a psychologist to discuss any matters that are important to you, including how to manage stress. Visit ccmsonline.org/physician-wellness to learn more.

CCMS has also come to the end of another fiscal year on March 31st. Tentatively, the numbers show that we added to our reserves to ensure that we have the funds needed for a rainy day. We also ended the fiscal year with over 775 members on the roster, though at the time of writing this, approximately 30 of those members have yet to renew their dues for 2025. I strongly encourage those who have not renewed to consider rejoining, and please do so by May 30th to be included in the next Physician Directory.

Legislative activity in Florida related to healthcare has been somewhat chaotic this year. CCMS, with our partners at the Florida Medical Association, is committed to representing physicians and patients with these challenges, including scope of practice, intrusion on the physician-patient relationship, tort concerns, administrative burdens, and more. The session is currently ongoing and could even be extended this year, so more news to come.

CCMS also regularly meets with our Collier County Commissioners. The primary issues we discussed this spring include emergency medical services, behavioral healthcare, public safety, and workforce housing. And speaking of workforce housing, Collier County has resources to help connect potential homebuyers/renters to area housing and to secure assistance with loans. Visit colliercountyhousing.com/ineed-housing for more details.

Be on the lookout for the CCMS e-newsletter every other Thursday, or possible email blast alerts, for news on legislative activity. And if you have not already, please consider a \$100 contribution to the CCMS Political Action Committee (PAC) for 2025. The PAC helps support medicine-friendly candidates for office who can represent our medical community. Visit ccmsonline.org/advocacy for details.

Much of the advocacy efforts from the FMA on our behalf are guided by policy set at the FMA Annual Meeting each summer. Your FMA delegation from CCMS is preparing to attend this year's meeting, July 25-27 in Orlando. There is still time to submit your resolution proposal for the FMA Annual Meeting to the CCMS Board for consideration. Successful resolutions can add to or change FMA policies. Email your resolution to april@ccmsonline.org by May 19th.

This year, Dr. Jose Baez will lead our delegation to the FMA. I pass the baton to Dr. Baez on June 14th at the CCMS Annual Meeting, where he will be installed as the 2025-26 CCMS President along with our new Board of Directors. We will also recognize Dr. Robert Tober with the CCMS Lifetime Achievement Award for his many efforts on behalf of our community over the years, particularly as Collier County's EMS medical director. Dr. Rolando Rivera, chair of the Foundation of CCMS, will be honored as the 2025 CCMS Physician of the Year, for going above and beyond as a physician and community leader. I hope to see many of you in attendance.

I also encourage you to support our Foundation, which provides scholarships to future medical professionals and funding to local healthcare programs in need. You can participate in their annual "Docs & Duffers" charity golf tournament and raffle on September 27th, either as a sponsor, golfer, prize donor, raffle entrant, and/or an attendee at the awards luncheon. I have been fortunate to attend this popular fundraiser almost every year, and I know many of us look forward to it each fall.

Dr. Rolando Rivera, CCMS Physician of the Year



Rolando Rivera, MD is the recipient of the 11th Annual CCMS Physician of the Year Award. This award honors a CCMS member who deserves special recognition for exemplary contributions to the practice of medicine and/or outstanding service to our community. Members of the Medical Society submitted nominations for the award to the CCMS Board of Directors,

who this year selected Dr. Rivera, as nominated by Dr. Rebekah Bernard.

"I'm deeply honored to receive the Physician of the Year award. This recognition is truly humbling, and I accept it on behalf of my family and the incredible team I work with every day," said Dr. Rivera. "Medicine is never a solo journey—it's built on collaboration, compassion, and continuous learning. Thank you for this meaningful acknowledgment."

Dr. Rivera is a board-certified urologist with over 20 years' experience in both male and female urologic care. He earned his medical degree from the University of Puerto Rico, followed by residency at the University of Florida, and fellowship training in Female Urology, Pelvic Surgery, and Urodynamics at the University of Miami.

Dr. Rivera, as founder and Board Chair of the Foundation of CCMS, has been instrumental in expanding its impact. In 2024, the Foundation exceeded a quarter of a million dollars in scholarships to future medical professionals over the past decade. The Foundation also surpassed \$50,000 in endowed funds in 2024, laying the groundwork for sustainable support of medical education. Under Dr. Rivera's leadership, the Foundation continues to help fund the CCMS Physician Wellness Program to address physician burnout.


In addition, Dr. Rivera serves on the board of the Physician Led Access Network (PLAN), is a past president of CCMS, and is the Section Chief of Urology at NCH and Market President for the Advanced Urology Institute of Southwest Florida. He is a Fellow

of the American College of Surgeons, a faculty member with Teleflex/Neotract, and actively contributes to the advancement of urologic care through industry collaboration, innovation, and education.

"I have referred him patients for over 15 years and have seen firsthand the exceptional care and compassion he provides," commented Dr. Bernard in her nomination. "And I've been personally inspired by his leadership and dedication to our community."

"Celebrating physicians who go above and beyond in both their practice and community service is one of the highlights of our year," said CCMS Board President, Dr. Zubin Pachori. "Dr. Rivera, congratulations on this well-earned honor—we're thankful for your leadership, generosity, and outstanding impact on our medical community."

Dr. Robert Tober, Lifetime Achievement Award



Robert Tober, MD is the recipient of the 2025 CCMS Lifetime Achievement Award. This award honors a CCMS member who deserves special recognition for making outstanding contributions to the practice of medicine, and displaying dedication, commitment, leadership, and excellence that spans their professional career and aligns with the CCMS mission.

Dr. Tober was selected for his decades of inspirational service as a physician, educator, public health advocate, volunteer, and visionary leader. He was nominated by his colleague at Collier County Emergency Medical Service, Dr. Douglas Lee, who described Dr. Tober's significant civic contributions and related that he "is an iconic pioneer who has demanded outstanding EMS standards and deserves honor and credit for the extraordinarily positive impact he has had on the quality of health care in Collier County."

Dr. Tober began his career at Naples Community Hospital in 1978 and cared for thousands of emergency medical patients during his two-decade tenure there, eventually serving as Chair of Emergency Medicine. Under his leadership, the Emergency Department developed the foundations of emergency medical care for heart attacks and strokes in this community. Dr. Tober also demonstrated visionary leadership as the founder of Collier County Emergency Medical Services and laid the groundwork



for what is now one of the most respected EMS programs in the region. Dr. Tober's groundbreaking initiatives have received world attention, such as pioneering the nation's first automated external defibrillators location tracking system for 911.

In addition, Dr. Tober spent 22 years volunteering at the Neighborhood Health Clinic, was named Florida EMS Medical Director of the Year twice, and served as President of the Florida College of Emergency Physicians. He has received the Florida Medical Association Roy M. Baker Award for Lifetime Achievements and the CCMS Physician of the Year Award, and the Collier County Board of Commissioners designated May 10, 2011 as Dr. Robert Boyd Tober Day. Throughout his career, he has remained a passionate advocate for public health and safety, working collaboratively with local government agencies, first responders, and community organizations.

"EMS has come a long way, from 6 ambulances, 18 paramedics and an old Vietnam Surplus helicopter to 28 ambulances and a new helicopter responding to about 45,000 calls per year," said Dr. Tober. "Our prehospital medical care remains sharp and proficient with repetitive practice, and on behalf of our emergency medical system, I thank CCMS for this honor."

"It is a privilege to recognize Dr. Tober for his lifetime of service and dedication to the advancement of emergency medicine," said CCMS Board President, Dr. Zubin Pachori. "His pioneering efforts in emergency response have saved countless lives and set a standard for excellence."





CCMS Empowers Community at Successful Women's Health Forum

As part of their ongoing initiative to establish connections between residents, visitors, and high-quality healthcare in Southwest Florida, Collier County Medical Society and the Foundation of CCMS were pleased to host the 16th Annual Women's Health Forum, "Take Control of Your Health and Wellness". The free health education event for the public was held on Saturday, April 5, 8:30am-12:45pm at the Naples United Church of Christ.

Approximately 300 participants at this popular forum enjoyed breakout sessions with educational talks from 24 CCMS member physicians, an exhibit hall with 20 vendors that offered resources, products, and solutions for women, and healthy refreshments. Nearly 20 volunteers and staff helped to make the event possible.

"We are thankful for the success of this year's Women's Health Forum, which once again served as a powerful platform for delivering medical insights to our attendees," said committee chair Dr. Theresa Vensel. "We are deeply appreciative of the physicians who shared their expertise and the supporters whose generosity helped us raise nearly \$3,500 for the Foundation of CCMS."

The Forum focused on helping attendees develop a deeper understanding of their bodies and gave tips on how to navigate a range of healthcare services so they can take control of their health and wellness. The presentations were designed to inform and inspire attendees on their wellness journeys so they achieve their healthcare goals, and included innovations in women's health, new medical technologies, and important developments in women's preventive care.

Presenters' topics included: Aesthetics, Breast Health, Cardiology, Fitness & Nutrition, Gastroenterology, Hearing, Memory, Menopause, Orthopedics, Sleep, Stress, Urology, Vascular Health, Vision, and more. Each presentation had a dedicated physician Q&A session, allowing attendees time to gain a deeper understanding of the topic.

Each year, the Forum also enables CCMS to donate funds to its charitable Foundation, to help provide scholarships for future medical professionals and support for local healthcare programs in need. 










Investing During Times of Economic Uncertainty: A Behavioral Finance Perspective

Economic uncertainty can be daunting for investors. With fluctuating markets and unpredictable events, it's natural to feel apprehensive. However, understanding the psychological aspects of investing can provide valuable insights. Inspired by Morgan Housel's "The Psychology of Money," this article explores how behavioral finance can guide investment decisions during uncertain times.

The Emotional Rollercoaster of Investing

Investing is deeply emotional. During economic uncertainty, emotions like fear, anxiety, and greed can impact decision-making. Behavioral finance highlights several biases:

- 1. Loss Aversion: The tendency to prefer avoiding losses over acquiring gains. During downturns, this can lead to premature selling, missing out on future gains. For example, the pain of losing \$100 is often more intense than the pleasure of gaining \$100. During economic downturns, loss aversion can lead investors to sell assets prematurely to avoid further losses, potentially missing out on future gains when the market recovers [1].
- 2. Herd Behavior: Following the majority during uncertainty, often resulting in buying high and selling low. The fear of missing out (FOMO) can drive irrational decisions, such as investing in overvalued assets during a market bubble [2].
- 3. Overconfidence: Overestimating one's ability to predict market movements, leading to excessive trading and risk-taking especially during volatile periods. Recognizing this bias can help investors adopt a more measured approach [1].

Strategies for Investing During Economic Uncertainty

To mitigate these biases, consider the following strategies:

- 1. **Diversification**: Spread investments across various asset classes, sectors, and geographies to reduce risk[1].
- 2. Long-Term Perspective: Focus on long-term goals rather than short-term fluctuations. Markets tend to recover over time. Economic uncertainty is often temporary, and markets tend to recover over time. Maintaining a long-term perspective can help avoid panic selling and rash decisions
- 3. Regular Review and Rebalancing: Periodically review and rebalance your portfolio to align with your risk tolerance and goals. This ensures that your portfolio remains diversified and reduces the impact of market volatility [1].
- 4. Stay Informed but Avoid Overreacting: Keep abreast of developments but avoid impulsive decisions based on short-term news. Emotional reactions to headlines can lead to poor investment choices [2].

The Power of Patience and Discipline

Morgan Housel emphasizes patience and discipline in investing. These qualities are crucial during uncertainty:

- 1. Set Clear Goals: Define financial objectives and create a plan. Clear goals help maintain focus and reduce impulsive reactions[3].
- 2. Automate Investments: Set up automatic contributions to ensure consistent investing regardless of market conditions[3].
- 3. Embrace Dollar-Cost Averaging: Invest a fixed amount at regular intervals to reduce the impact of volatility[3].

Learning from Historical Context

Economic uncertainty is not new. History offers valuable lessons:

- 1. **Resilience of Markets:** Despite downturns, markets have shown remarkable recovery. This can instill confidence in long-term investing[3].
- 2. **Behavioral Patterns**: Historical market behavior reveals recurring patterns influenced by psychology. Recognizing these can help anticipate movements[3].
